



Forest road network in all blocks requires a significant upgrade.

Many forest coupes have not been thinned or have not had subsequent thinning.

Remaining mature crops are in need of prompt felling.

Coupes in need of thinning.

Areas which should be converted to CCF.

Forest edge trees require felling due to windblow.

Good quality Sycamore and Birch which requires thinning.

Areas of long term retention.

Lack of broadleaves in riparian zones.

Wetland linked with riparian zone relating to Buchanty Burn.

Remove roadside Sitka Spruce to free broadleaves.

Occurance of windblow on exposed edge.

Encroaching tree cover on forest roads, which is leading to roading issues.

Issues with crop stability.

Broadleaf stand would be a prime candidate for Group Shelterwood.

Recently cleared windblow area.

Forest road has become completely overgrown and is only suitable for 4x4 vehicles.

Forest road forms part of the riparian zone and restricts future access.

Forest roads used by walkers, horse riders and members of Methven Anglers Club.

Good growth rates with Sitka Spruce but hampered by wet soil.
