

Tracks and trails crossing over the site and are used by the public.

Pitfichie and Corrennie forest is a productive woodland for construction timber and fire wood. The main species include Sitka Spruce, Scots Pine and Larch.

Plantation on Ancient Woodland Sites (PAWS) are located in this forest area.

Two car parks are located on the east side where recreation is considered to have a higher value.

The A944 crosses through the site.

Approximately 25% of Pitfichie and Corrennie forest remains open much of it covered by heather.
