

Summary of Laggan Land Management Plan 2015-2025 Proposals

Laggan Forest is a mixed conifer and broadleaved woodland. It lies on the eastern outskirts of the village of Comrie and on the north side of the busy A85. It was established in the late 1950s and is predominantly Norway spruce with other species that include Scots pine, Larch, Douglas fir and noble Fir. Although thinned recently Laggan has missed earlier thinning windows with windblow a consequence of the most recent harvesting operations. The importance of this area of the forest is recognised with both SSSI and SAC designations.

Significant environment/ Conservation features	
Designated sites	The oak woodland feature of the designated site was last monitored in 2009, and is due to be monitored again before 2018. The SAC (SSSI), on the eastern side of the gorge of the River Lednock, River Earn NSA. The Highland Boundary Fault runs through the wood and is visible in a number of places.

- Re-establishment of broadleaved species using natural regeneration where possible.
- Effective management of deer and other grazing/browsing species
