



## Angus Glens Land Management Plan - Concept Consultation Feedback Summary

The concept consultation for the new Angus Glens Land Management Plan (LMP), covering Glen Prosen and Glen Doll, comprised: public engagement events where we spoke to over 200 people about their thoughts, ideas, concerns regarding our land management concept; a short public survey; email newsletter containing links to plan maps/documents and online feedback form; meetings and site visits with stakeholders during the development of the LMP concept and during the public consultation period May-July 2024. These conversations, together with feedback through the survey, are helping to shape the next stage of detailed planning.

The survey was available to complete online via the Angus Glens web page and also on paper at Glen Doll Ranger Centre and other public events, we had 71 responses. The survey contained our questions:

1. What aspects of the plan are you most interested in? (Tick as many as you see fit)
2. What do you most like about the plan, and why?
3. Is there a part of the plan that you would like to see improved, if so how?
4. Please add any further comments relating to the plan here.

### Summary of key messages

- Broad support for native woodland creation and habitat restoration, as part of land use change and nature-based solutions to issues such as flooding and climate change.
- Involving local people and communities is really important both in the planning and throughout the life of the project
- Consideration needs to be given to how we manage deer and the balance of wildlife in the landscape
- Estate buildings need to be in use to provide economic and community benefits
- Lots of opportunities to share data and learning more widely, research project and
