The infrastructure is already unable to cope with the current numbers of visitors and it would be madness to encourage more by the provision of more facilities without repairing and improving the road verges for a start. The increase in visitors being attracted to the Pools has brought attendant problems: sanitation; the exponential increase in uncontrolled dogs; wild camping and attendant fires; the dumping of discarded camping equipment, broken glass and other rubbish in the river and around the glen; and most importantly the overloading and break down of our only access road. What we see is a general disregard for the environment and a lack of understanding of the way of life of the glen. We would point out that the Scottish Government has proposed a new designation, that of Wild Land Area, for the Cullin Hills, and further development around the Fairy Pools would run counter to the purpose of this WLA designation, which is to keep certain places where it is still possible to experience a feeling of wilderness and serenity free from human development. In taking upon itself the redevelopment and operation of an extended car park, the community/MCHA is thereby taking on the responsibility for the management and 'policing' of the same. It is critical that MCHA puts in place measures to deter people from parking on the roadside, which could still occur despite there being ample space in the carpark, and also measures to prevent the car park from being used for overnight parking or wild camping. Perhaps remuneration from the car park users could be put towards the upkeep of the road, the provision of some sort of barriers alongside the road verge at critical points, yellow lines around the car park entrance, new passing place signs, etc.

I expect that LARGE amounts of money will be used in this project so it needs to be right first time. Prevention of parking on verges MUST be implemented otherwise it will be a waste of time and resources. (I use the word potentially above to indicate that wooden posts would be better aesthetically than the type that have been used at the Slig for example) 2 - yes toilet facilities are a must but again, suitably designed to fade into the background. 3 - yes tourist information will also - even by it being there - enhance the tourists pleasure and RESPECT of the unofficial heritage site that it is. 4 - the residents are at risk at ALL times with regard to access to their homes of emergency vehicles when required.
