## Summary of North Rannoch Land Management Plan 2016-2026 Proposals

The Land Management Plan for North Rannoch is composed of two forest blocks, Rannoch Lodge and Talladh a Bheithe. These forests are typical of many commercial upland forest which are heavily influenced by soil type, climate and the legacy of an even age structure. Both forests have sizable areas of PAWS designated ground and scattered heritage features of which some are exposed and others are still under tree cover.

## **Critical Success Factors**


- The deer population is maintained at a level where browsing has minimal impact,
- Windblown areas are cleared and restocked as per the recommendations of this plan,
- Site/species selection principles are applied to restocking coupes,
- Landscape design is carried out to a high standard in order to reflect the NSA sensitivities,
- CCF coupes are actively managed.




