

Summary of Land Management Plan Proposals

Analysis of the available information has led to the **primary objective** for this block being the management of the woodland to further encourage the use of the woodland by the local community.

An additional **secondary objective** for the future management of the woodland has been identified as:

- growing a quality crop of timber using LISS where appropriate and restocking with a wider range of conifer and broadleaf species.



Critical success factors:

- Maintain the current recreational infrastructure;
- Continue with an active thinning programme to ensure the ongoing success of the LISS areas;
- Use adaptive management of the LISS regeneration to achieve greater species diversity;
- Expand species and structural diversity to increase forest resilience.
